Call to order, approval of minutes

S. Potter called the meeting to order at 8:31pm. Mission and vision statement of Georgia Swimming (GASI) presented

Officer Reports

General Chair (S. Potter) Welcome, no report submitted. Attended the Southern Zone Age Group Championship at Tupelo Mississippi. Saw some great swims. Thank you to Sydney, Kevin, Georgia Staff, and Officials who supported this meet.

Admin Vice-Chair (L. Ferreira) not present, report submitted.

Finance Committee (R. Copeland, K. Sullivan) report submitted. R. Copeland reported that the committee is in the final process of moving banks. K. Sullivan is busy opening new checking and investment accounts. He met with a new investment advisor today. He is doing a phenomenal job unwinding all the black log of the past few months.

Georgia LSC proposed budget: GA LSC Budget 2022-2023

R. Copeland presented an overview of the Budget to be presented to the fall HoD.

- Registration: Revenue was kept to the same amount as last year for the LSC portion. Hoping both Athlete and Officials numbers will go up
- Budget Income Total Income \$321,170
 - All Stars same (pass through).
 - Dividend Income reduced due to current market.
 - o Fine amount from State Championship meets increased due to historical data.
 - Camp registrations same (pass through).
 - Sanction Fees reduced to 2%, due to Athlete Surcharge change, \$66,000 to \$19,000.
 - Registration increase due to growth of GA Swimming, with \$500,000 pass through to USAS as a result of new methodology for USA Swimming fees.
 - Sponsorships and Donations currently unknown.
 - Zone teams pass through
- Budget Expenses \$309,750
 - Operating Expenses just over \$103,000 operating expense (Marketing, Legal, Audit, Office Staff, Operating Expenses, Bank Charges, Investment Expenses, Registration service, Registration Supply, Awards).
 - Office staff increase due to bringing in paid bookkeeper. Keeping Volunteer Treasurer as necessary with 5013c organization.
 - Program and services
 - All Star Ceremony/Spring meeting/awards slight increase
 - Athletes increase \$3,800 to \$5,000, added additional summit with speaker cost

- **Discussion:** (H. Convery) Senior Committee discussed making the Senior Championship meets smaller; more select. The priority is to make the meets more special for the athletes. They should be Showcase Events. Qualifying times have been tightened to make the meet more restricted; harder to qualify. The concern becomes with fewer entries it will be harder for the host team to break even financially. The Committee would like the LSC to retain support for these meets. They propose up to \$5,000, per meet, to cover Host financial loss, if the net revenue from the meet is less than \$10,000. In case of shortfall, the Host team would need to submit an expense report to Financial Committee for reimbursement. This proposal should apply to both Senior and Age Group State Championship Meets.
 - E. Pingel (Sanction Chair) asked if the sanction fees could be increased for these meets to cover this expense. K. Krug noted this is a separate issue and would need to be brought up at the HoD.

R. Copeland reviewed the LSC Balance sheet as of August 8, 2022.

- R. Copeland noted that there is a line noting \$4,000 donor restricted funds that will be going specifically to Disability.
- H. Convery asked about getting specific numbers of athletes per meet to begin to accurately track numbers for the National Travel Fund. E. Pingel noted that K. Sullivan created a document that he is using when he invoices sanctions which includes number of swimmers per meet. He will add H. Convery, R. Copeland to its distribution. R. Copeland noted that H. Convery, he, and K. Sullivan need to get together and figure out numbers so there is no overlap in billing.

S. Potter thanked R. Copeland and his committee for his transparency and insight into the LSC funds. This is unprecedented in recent years.

Senior Chair (H. Convery) report submitted

- Committee discussion centered on improving the LC State Meet. Eliminated 50 cuts and they will become bonus swims. This past year, 120 swimmers qualified simply on 50's cuts and that is not what the meet is about. This change should shorten prelims. Next year's meet will be at Georgia Tech, and it may run Thursday through Saturday, not sure if Sunday will be available.
- Did final tweaking of SC Championship meet, added scratch box.

Travel Fund Report Travel Fund Budget 2022-2023

(H. Convery) report submitted. Committee met and set distribution levels for funds. Suggestion was made for Seniors, that have Futures cuts that get closed out of Futures meets and must go to equivalent meets (Senior Zones, NCSA Juniors). They should still be eligible for reimbursement, as long as they have the Futures cut prior to the meet.

H. Convery reported that current numbers may show lower income from meets this summer
with higher requests for reimbursement. The numbers may be a little over budget but that is
why we had the seed money allocated. Future budgets should be more accurate as we gather
data.

Age Group Chair (S. Pepper) Zones went well. Georgia came in 2nd. One incident occurred but that has been turned over to the Board of Review. We had two chaperones, plus one athlete, leave with COVID.

 Big changes coming at the Zone level; shortening the meet as well as possibly removing seniors and adding age groupers. This will be good for Georgia as we have a hard time filling the older slots as Futures meets take a lot of those swimmers. Next year's location has not been announced yet but possibly Cary, NC for pool. Open Water could be Seven Lakes, NC or maybe Georgia.

Discussion: H. Convery asked about the financial implication of the potential changes to the meet. S.Pepper stated that she doesn't know yet but it would be the same number of athletes. Costs could go down if the meet is shortened by one day, but it will depend on where the meet is held. If close enough to return Saturday night might be less.

Diversity (T. Jackson) will be meeting tomorrow. Working on Diversity meet. We have Meet Information, Meet Referee, Starter, S&T, but still looking for a Venue. Waiting on C. Tavares about using Lanier Aquatics pool.

Secretary (N. Harmon) Congratulations to all the swimmers at both Age Group Zones and Juniors. It was very special at Zones when the entire venue supported Brook's son Max in his mile. At Juniors, Dynamo ended up 2nd in the girl's competition and 3rd overall combined. Both meets were special and a good showcase for Georgia athletes.

Registrar (L. Thompson) Online member registration begins September 1, 2022. L. Thompson knows that there is apprehension, but she is excited for what it will offer. She's been working on setting up clubs this week as clubs admins may begin working with the system on August 15, 2022. **Discussion**: H. Convery expressed concern over losing the website during this transition. J. Pepper has been assured that the move will be seamless, but he will check and notify H. Convery tomorrow.

Business Manager (J. Pepper) report submitted. Had a conversation with Mary at Georgia Tech. She advised him that in 2025 they will be redoing the pool to replace the moveable floor. We will be out of a venue for the summer.

Coaches Chair (J. Swain, A. Beggs). J. Pepper welcomed Jason and Andrew as the new Coaches' Representatives. J. Swain stated they are working with J. Pepper to get a job description. In the meantime, they are excited to bring back the Coach's Retreat and looking forward to talking to the coaches to get their input on what type of education they'd like to see.

Open Water (M. Green) no report. J. Pepper asked if M. Green or K. Sullivan would be at Swim Across America? M. Green replied, she will not. B. Kubik asked if Swim Across America would be used as a Selection meet for Zones? M. Green stated no, but the Valdosta Meet and Open Water State Meet in April are. All still appear in the newsletter as an Open Water Opportunity.

Governance Committee (K. Krug) will be scheduling meeting this week. Committee will be discussing Officials Advancement, Reserves, and the slate of candidates for the Spring HoD. Additionally, designing a new survey that hopefully will go out in September.

Operational Risk (B. Kubik) no report, meeting scheduled next week. Waiting on Georgia Tech regarding their contingency plans. Sent a document to J. Pepper concerning pool chemicals, got good feedback.

Safe Sport (M. O'Shaughnessy) not present, no report

Athletes (R. Todebush, H. Mattson**)** R. Todebush reported that the Athletes Wellness Summit will be held at Greater Atlanta Christian (GAC) September 10, 2022. There will be a light swim, lunch, Sport Psychologist, and Yoga Instructor. Cost is \$25.00 to attend. Link to register will be available in a few days. Welcomed the new Junior Representative, Holly Mattson, Columbus Hurricanes and Will Guichard, Junior Representative at-large, who swims for Swim Atlanta.

Officials (E. Saltzman) no report, next Official's Meeting, August 15, 2022, 7:00pm.

Technical Planning (M. Grant) not present, no report. H. Convery reported that the Technical Planning meeting to approve the Short Course schedule, will be held Thursday, August 25, 2022.

Disability (T. Coan) T. Coan introduced herself as the Georgia LSC coach representative for Disability Athletes. She has been contacting other LSCs to broaden our reach to find more athletes and get more disability athletes going to Zones. She has spoken to several physical therapists to get the word out to get more athletes locally. She feels we need to better showcase our disability athletes as she was disappointed in the coverage from Zones as the athletes scored many points. It was hard to find their results; they deserved the recognition. She plans on reaching out to G. Orth and others on the committee to discuss clinics and what the athletes want and need to get them into the pipeline as the US Para team needs them. She's excited for The Fred and has people contacting her about it. She is available if anyone needs her to travel to their pool to help with swimmer's who train differently. She is willing to give her email, phone number to anyone to help get these athletes into the pipeline.

Old Business

GASI Reserve Policy (R. Copeland)

Same policy (see attached) that was presented a few months ago and discussed last meeting. This is a policy to guide the LSC's use of reserve funds.

Discussion: H. Convery would like to see the verbiage of Operating Reserve 6.3.1.1 better defined. S. Potter suggested that we give R. Copeland time to add specifics and finalize this Policy at the BoD meeting August 27, 2022, just prior to the HoD. Both R. Copeland and H. Convery agreed.

New Business

Seasonal Membership Proposal (L. Thompson)

Starting with 2022-2023 registration, Flex membership will be available to only 12 and under. Per USAS, athletes may only have one Seasonal membership per year. When the 150 days expire, they must upgrade to a premium membership to continue. L. Thompson proposes that we have our seasonal membership apply for 150 days, starting anytime during the season. The new system (swims3.0) will track their membership for the 150 days without the need to monitor it. This will allow more flexibility for older athletes, especially high schoolers, than with the defined season one and season two option, that we had prior.

May be initiated anytime during season

 Swims3.0 will automatically track. If expires and the swimmers wishes to sign up for a meet or continue training, they can just pay the fee difference. This is the same language as the Flex membership.

Here is the agenda:

1. Review of LC Sr State.

- a. Discussion about ways to shorten meet. Ian M (DYNA) initiated discussion about purpose of the meet leading committee to reaffirm that this should be a quality meet for the neat top athletes of the LSC. Avoid flighting (strong support), no chase starts unless absolutely necessary, adequate cuts to ensure reasonably sized preliminary session (3 ½ hrs).
- b. Looking ahead to next year's meet having it at Tech and making the 50s stroke bonus events and eliminating qualifying times for them (swimmer must have the QT in the 100/200 of that stroke to opt to swim the 50) should reduce the length of prelims.
- c. The committee did not feel there needed to be protected heats at nnight for 18U
- d. The committee affirmed the continuation of LC only cuts
- e. The meet will utilize a Scratch box w/ no penalty. The committee also asked that the admin officials look at an online scratch procedure.
- f. Para swimmers in finals Wes Hamborg will get rec's from disability com. For a way to have 1-2 heats for para swimmers in finals.
- g. Proof of times/fines. Currently 100 swims on the exception report. Going out this week and then teams will have 30 days to appeal after which fines are due.

2022 Zone Workshop Legislation

I would ask the LSC to reduce the 120 days to 30-45 days at HOD and have put in place a 30-days stop on all transfers between clubs unless of a club shutting their doors or in the case of extreme safe sport issues (i.e. bullying, out casting, or mental of physical abuse to the athlete) before a LSC or Zone championship meet (Senior, Age Group State, Sectionals or AG/Senior Zone Championships (Open Water/Pool)).. At the LSC level I would recommend that in the case of Safe Sport issues, that the Safe Sport Chair get involved and investigate the issues brought forth in the request of the transfer.

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Southern Zone Budget

I would ask that the delegates of Georgia Swimming lean to the opinion of allowing a swimmer surcharge to be placed in the entry fees for all meets in the Zone. The fee would be \$5.00 that will be collected at the zone level meet and sent to the Southern Zone Treasurer. The following meet are in the zone; AG and Sr Zones, AG Sectionals, Sr Sectionals, and Open Water (Sectionals fall into the meets of Eastern Sr Sectionals – Spring, AG Sectionals, Eastern Sr Summer Sectionals, and other Southern Sectionals in Sarasota, Coral Springs and Plantation and Gainesville Sectionals) By applying the \$5.00 surcharge per swimmer in these meets instead of the .25 charge to all registered member of the Southern Zone. These members are coaches, officials, and only the premium athletes. (Not included are Season1 and 2 swimmers, Flex Members, and outreach members)

I would not recommend the splash fee be applied at the meets and only the surcharge. By approving the surcharge, the whole LSC is not hit with the .25 fee and have more push back from clubs that do not take part in the Sectional Meets.

The current fee that each LSC pays every year is \$50.00 and the increase will go towards athlete grants and travel reimbursement of Zone BoD members and coaches.

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Seasonal Membership Proposal – L. Thompson (Registrar)

Proposed change to 3.2.2

3.2.2 <u>Individual Seasonal Athlete Member</u> – An Individual Seasonal Athlete Member is an individual who participates in the sport of swimming, who has joined for a period of time not longer than 150 days in a registration year and is an Individual Member of USA Swimming in good standing. The Individual Season will begin on the date of registration and expire 150 days from that date. This membership type may begin at any point in the current membership year. By rule, an athlete may only register for one seasonal membership per registration year. The cost of an Individual Season Membership may be applied to the cost of year-round Athlete Membership, provided the individual makes the transition to full time within the same membership year.
